Hazara division is the part of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province located in the north of Pakistan. China and Pakistan are connected through Hazara region and Khunjrab pass. China is the emerging international economic power; it is in the process of becoming a new actor in the international political economy. China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) will improve the infrastructure, accelerate industrialization, and reduce unemployment in Pakistan and resultantly the living standards of the people of the country in general and that of Hazara region in particular. On the other hand, it will also damage the already deteriorated environmental condition in the area and exhaust already limited resources of the area. Though the project will bring development and prosperity in the countries and nationalities from where it passes but it will also bring challenges for the areas and people inhibiting the region connected to the road. The impacts may be direct or indirect in influencing the regions. It may impact the natural resources of the country. The arrival of multinational companies in the country will start the over consumption and over exploitation of the natural resources of the country.

Social Effects

It is reported that the numbers of trucks working in the project has reach to seven thousand a day (Khan, 2018).

The transportation between Gwadar and Kashgar will cast adverse effects on the glaciers in the way. The smoke and toxic gasses settle in the glaciers and form a black layer. It causes two adverse effects on the glaciers; firstly, it reduces the reflectivity of the snow and secondly it increases the absorption capacity of snow and results in speedy melting process and lack of formation. The authorities of the time should feel the sensitivity of the environmental changes all around the world and may look into the hasty government and may reconsider the decision taken. This project has both benefits and costs for the environmental condition of Hazara region (Ahmed, 2018).

It is not only the transportation which will cause environmental costs but also the projects aimed for the power generation will cause serious environmental changes in the region. The authorities of the country are optimistic regarding the installation of the power generation project under the auspice of CPEC project. The power projects are expected to play a very decisive role in forthcoming industrialization in areas connected to CPEC. It is generally believed that most of the projects of energy generation will be coal oriented means the energy will be generated by burning coal. Coal is the cheapest means of power generation in the modern age and Pakistan has a huge reservoir of coal and it will be utilized and mined for the generation of energy and will have serious implication for the environmental security of Hazara region of Pakistan (Aziz, 2019).

The utilization of Coal in large amount will cast serious implications on the environmental health. Unfortunately, the project connected to CPEC about power generation lacks economic cost benefit analysis in the country. The former state minister of environment has expressed serious concerns about the environmental future of the area (Baloch, 2018).

In Pakistan about forty-six percent of the emission was emitted by the burning of coal for the purpose of power generation in 2012. Pakistan has doubled down the use of coal for the generation of energy. All around the world the use of coal was reduced to two percent in 2016. China reduced its utilization of coal by 1.5 percent while United Kingdom claimed to have reduced its coal consumption to 52.5 percent (Baloch, 2018).

In the contemporary world China is the living example. She has achieved a phenomenal economic growth and progress in the past few decades along with a catastrophic damage to its environmental security. The environmental damage is mostly due to the use of coal for the generation of power projects in China which is contributing in large amount to the economic development of China. The people living in the big cities of China suffer from various diseases of lungs and other diseases of the kind resulting in the reduction of life expectancy in the country. The coals are generally used for medium and short-term planning and are not used in the long-term projects due to its serious implications for the heath of environmental security of the world (Gardiner, 2017). Though the environmental issues linked with CPEC cannot be avoided however, it can be decreased by adopting precautionary measures in the use of coal and other material used for the generation of power.

Deforestation and CPEC in Hazara

CPEC is a huge project and passes through the forest covered mountainous region of Hazara. The growing dilution of the nature will cause health problems in the Hazara region. The wildlife is no exception to escape the adversities of natural dilution and pollution. The already scarce water resources will feel greater pressure in the economic growth and economic development of the area. Soil erosion will also increase in the face with the decreased vegetation. Land sliding and flooding will increase in the region (Ebrahim, 2017).

It is the foremost duty of the ruling elite to intercept various projects and analyses it value regarding its damaging and environmental impacts. The government is required to give the institution responsibility regarding the assessment of the damage caused by the projects to the

The latest technology for the coal-based industry causes less pollution as the gas-based plants. Its efficiency level is high and has a less fuel consumption per Megawatt. As the result of this project the government of KP has planted a huge number of trees in the region to secure the environmental security of the region. In Pakistan the share of Industrial Sector in the economic development of the country is very large. Its contribution is about twenty-five percent in the gross domestic product of Pakistan. The sector consists of small, medium, and large scales. The contribution of the large-scale industry in the economy of Pakistan in the initial years of independence was 1.8percent in the gross domestic product of Pakistan. At that time, however, the contribution of the small-scale industries was more than the large sector. At that time its share was

4.6 percent to the GDP. At present the situation has improved to some extent, in the fiscal year of 2010-2011 the share of large-scale industries increased to 4.4 percent and that of small-scale industries increased to 7.5 percent. It may be deduced that in the decades after independence the

contribution of the industrial has remained not so impressive and encouraging for the rest of the history. Though Pakistan has a lot of potential to be developed industrially however, the non- seriousness behaviour and imprudent decisions of our ruling elite has remained the main hindrances in the way of industrial development of Pakistan. Industrial sector is the only sector, if developed properly, can cure all the ills of the economic system and economic development of the region (Sadaf, 2012).

Like the other underdeveloped state, the industrial sector of Pakistan is facing strict competition with in the national and international market. At present the most important competitor of Pakistan is China. There is a competition between Pakistan and China's industrial sector. In the internal economy China has a gigantic share. It became the member of World Trade in 2001. Since then, China has given a tremendous boost to trade in the international market. The world saw a great increase in its exports. China is rising as a new economic power in the world. It is also influencing the economies of other underdeveloped and developing economies of the world (Amir, Rizwan & Bano, 2018). It is evident that the economic system of the countries connected to China will be influenced by China. China is preparing to play a deceived role in the international political economy.
